Bureau of Immigration

The Bureau of Immigration is principally responsible for the administration and enforcement of immigration, citizenship, and alien admission and registration laws in accordance with the provisions of the Philippine Immigration Act of 1940. It also plays a role in the enforcement of RA 9208, also known as the Anti-Trafficking In Persons Act of 2003.

Commission on Audit

It has the primary function to examine, audit and settle all accounts and expenditures of the funds and properties of the Philippine government. The Commission has the power, authority and duty to examine, audit and settle all accounts pertaining to the revenue and receipts of and expenditures or uses of the funds and properties of the Philippine government. Towards that end, it has the exclusive authority to define the scope, techniques and methods of its auditing and examination procedures. It also may prevent and disallow irregular, unnecessary, excessive, extravagant or unconscionable expenditures, or uses of government funds and properties.





The Department of the Interior and Local Government, abbreviated as DILG, is the executive department of the Philippine government responsible for promoting peace and order, ensuring public safety and strengthening local government capability aimed towards the effective delivery of basic services to the citizenry.

Department of the Interior and Local Government

The DOLE is the national government agency mandated to formulate and implement policies and programs, and serve as the policy-advisory arm of the Executive Branch in the field of labor and employment. DOLE is the national government agency mandated to formulate policies, implement programs and serve as the policy-coordinating arm of the Executive Branch in the field of labor and employment. it has continuously evolved its thrusts and strategies to respond to emerging socio-political and economic challenges while Keeping as primary concern the protection and promotion of the welfare of local and overseas Filipino workers (OFWs).

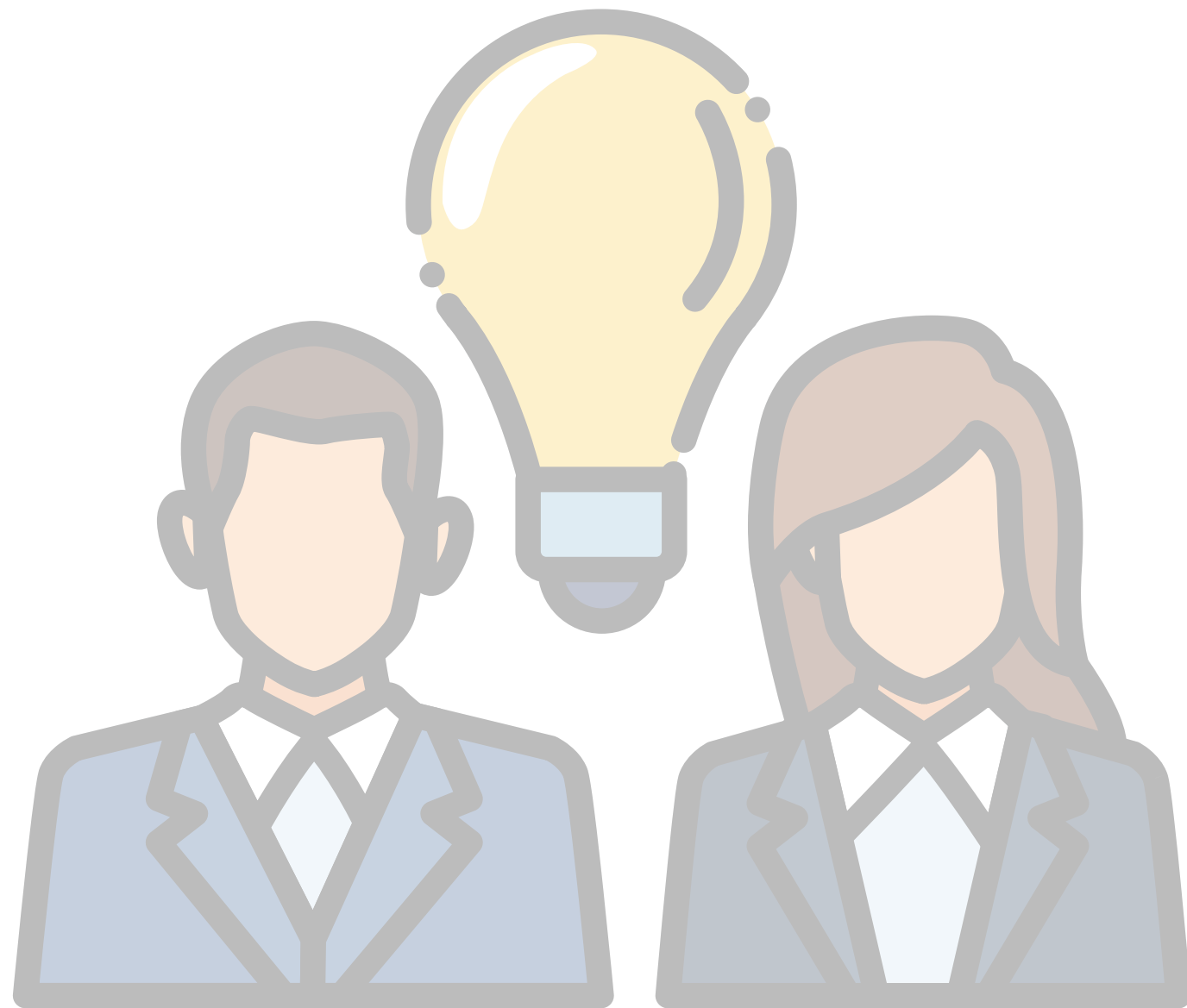

The Freedom of Information (FOI) Program is the Government's response to the call for transparency and full public disclosure of information. FOI is a government mechanism, which allows Filipino citizens to request any information about government transactions and operations provided that it shall not put into jeopardy privacy and matters of national security.

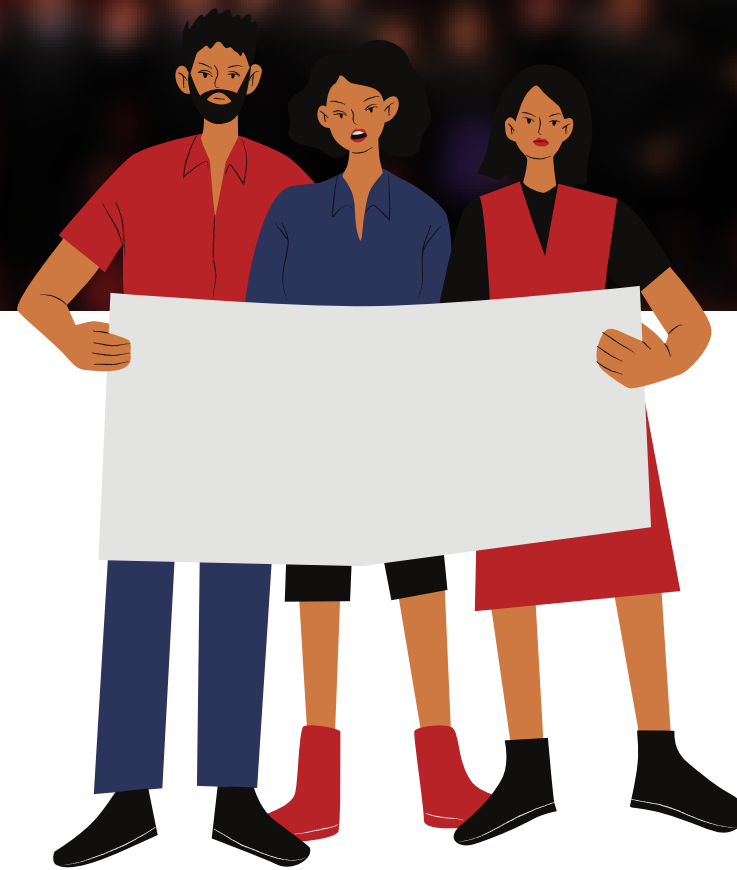

Integrated Bar of the Philippines

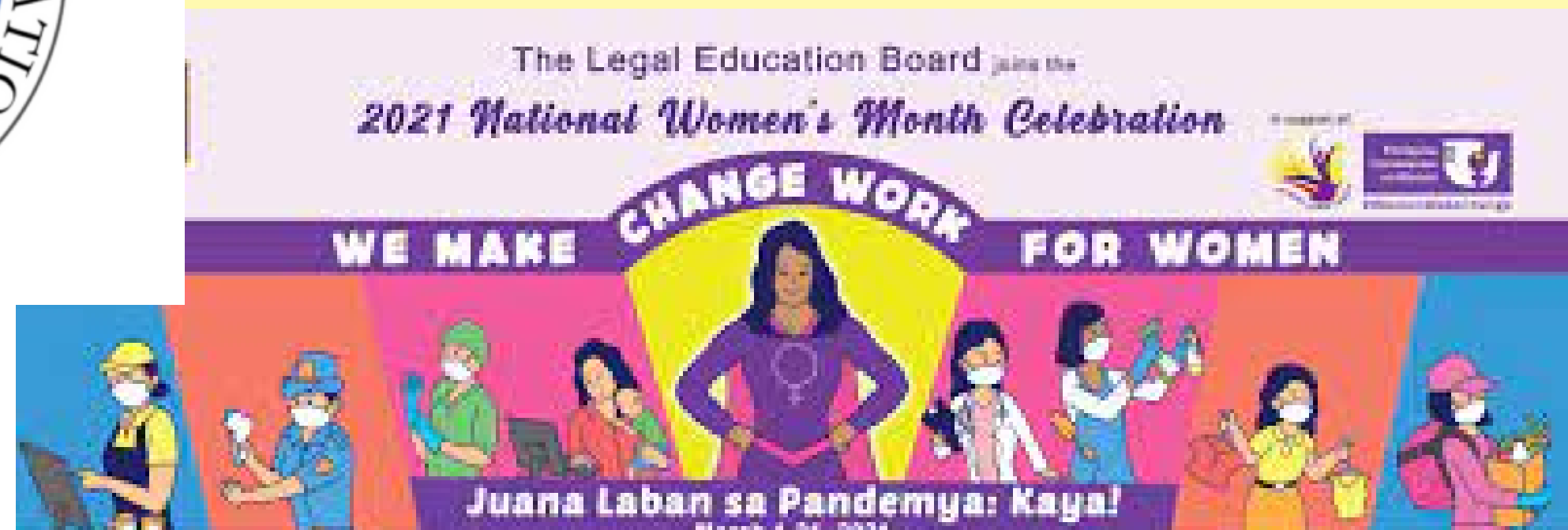


The Integrated Bar of the Philippines (IBP) is the official organization of all Philippine lawyers whose names appear in the Roll of Attorneys of the Supreme Court. Republic Act No. 6397 confirmed the power of the Supreme Court to adopt rules of court to effect the integration of the Philippine Bar.

Presidential Decree. No. 181 was promulgated on May 4, 1973 constituting the IBP into a body corporate and providing government assistance thereto for the accomplishment of its purposes.

Legal Education Board

The Legal Education Board was created pursuant to R.A. No. 7662, also known as the Legal Education Reform Act of 1993. The law was approved by President Fidel V. Ramos on 23 December 1993. The primary policy of the law is to reform and uplift the standards of legal education in the country. Towards this end, the State shall undertake appropriate reforms in legal education, require proper selection of law students, maintain quality among law schools, and require legal apprenticeship and continuing legal education.

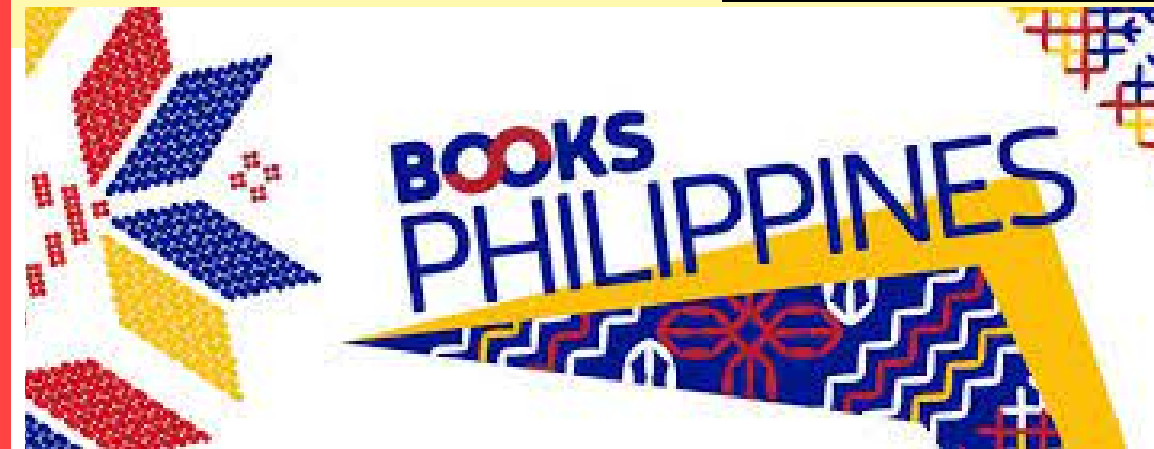


Book Publishing Industry Development Act, was a clear demonstration of the government's attention to the important role of books in nation building. The law created the National Book Development Board (NBDB) which is tasked primarily to formulate and implement a National Book

Policy with a corresponding National Book Development Plan geared towards the development of the book publishing industry. Philippine government under the

Department of Education formed through Republic Act No. 8047 or the Book Publishing Industry Development Act which was responsible for promoting the continuing development of the book publishing industry

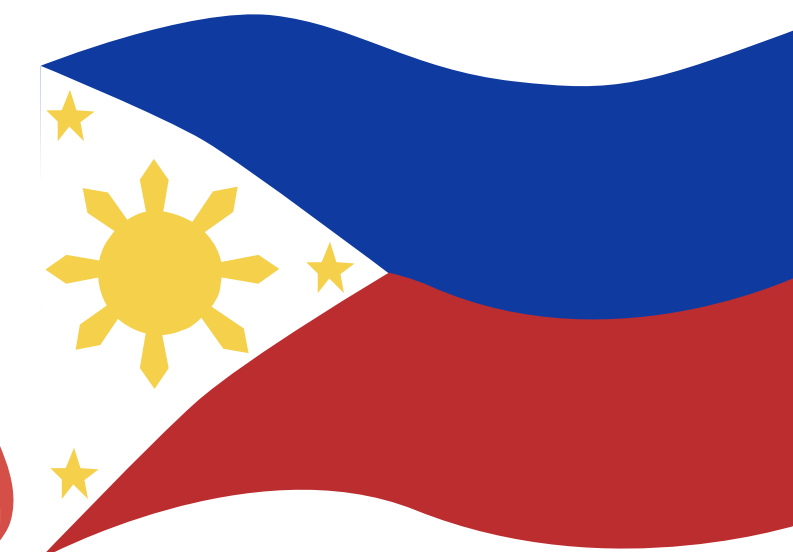

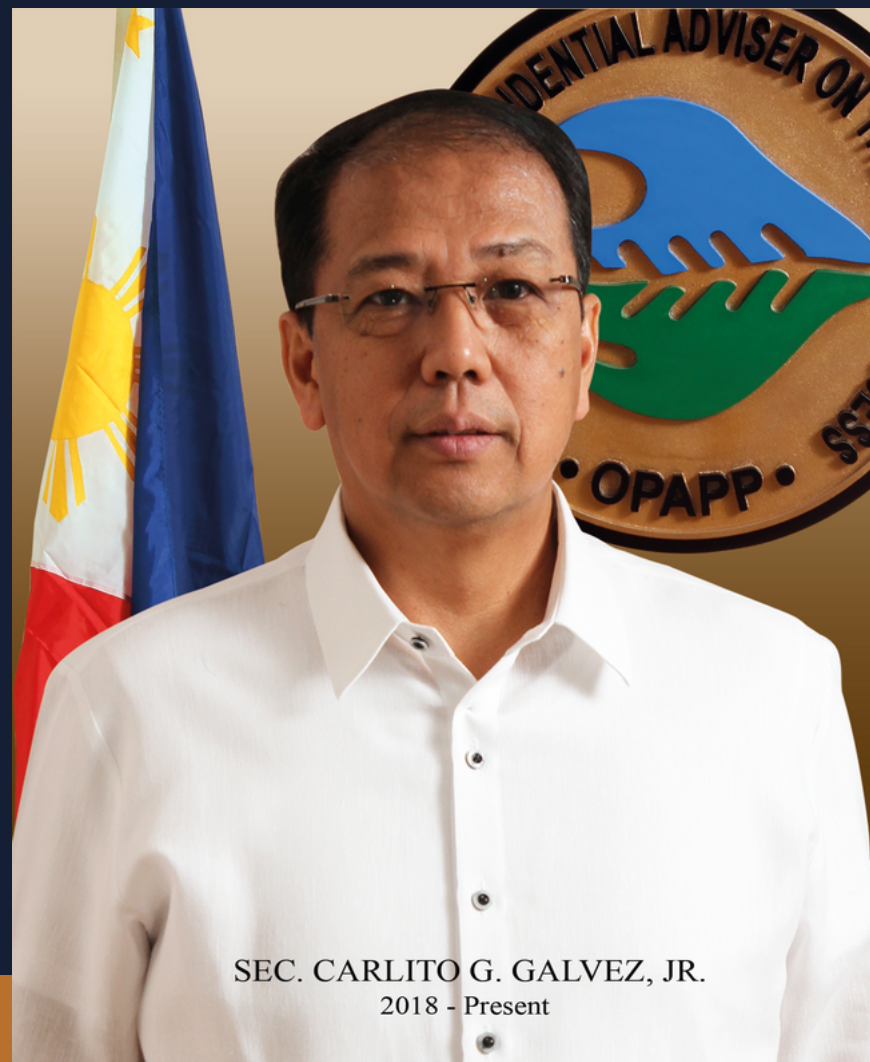

The Office of the Presidential Adviser on the Peace Process or OPAPP is the office mandated to oversee, coordinate, and integrate the implementation of the comprehensive peace process. The agency was created through Executive Order No. 125, s. 1993 which was later amended in 2001 with the signing of Executive Order No. 3, s. 2001 as a reaffirmation of the government's commitment to achieving just and lasting peace through a comprehensive peace process.



Office of the Vice President

Official Website of the Office of the Vice President of the Republic of the Philippines. Develop and implement programs to ensure effective and efficient delivery of social services to the Filipino people, especially the laylayan or those on the fringes of society; Collaborate with appropriate government and non-government agencies, financial institutions, socio-economic groups and people's organizations, for possible support to Local Government Units (LGUs) and their constituents, and as an active partner in identifying and implementing government programs; and



Philippine Statistics Authority

The PSA responsible for the implementation of the objectives and provisions of R.A. 10625, R.A. 11055, and R.A. 11315. It shall plan, develop, prescribe, disseminate, and enforce policies, rules and regulations, and coordinate government-wide programs governing the production of official statistics, general purpose statistics, civil registration services and inclusive identification system.





Sandiganbayan

Special court which has jurisdiction over criminal and civil cases involving graft and corrupt practices and such other offenses committed by public officers and employees. Decisions and resolutions of the court from 2003.

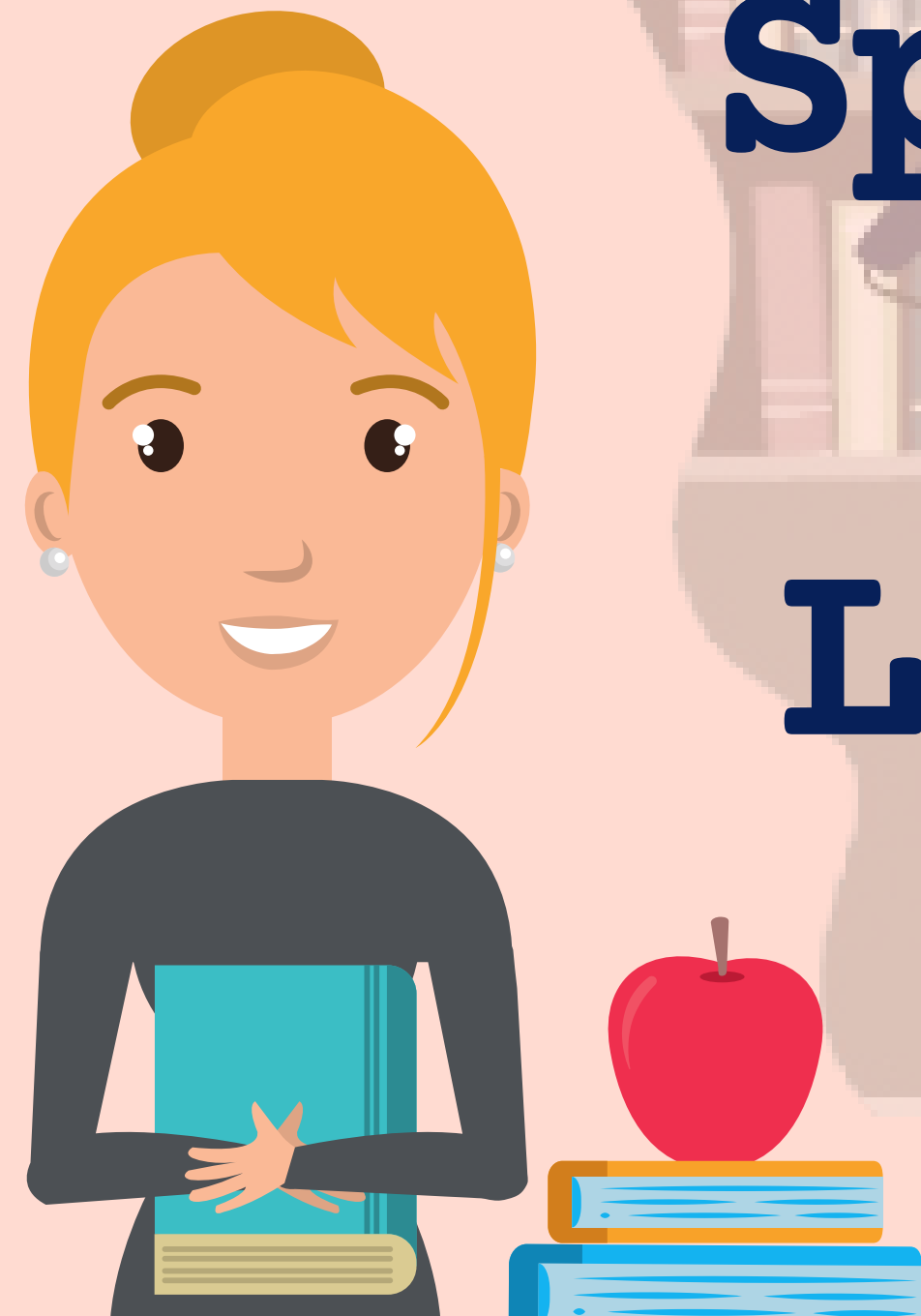

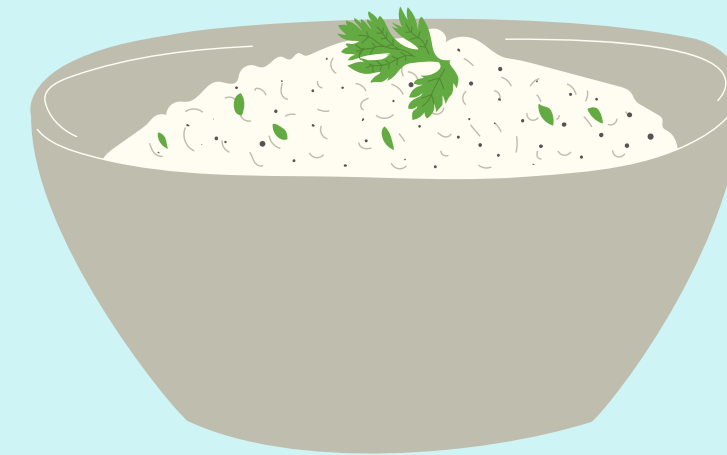
