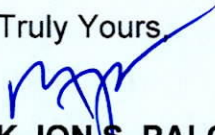

PROCUREMENT OF SERVICE PROVIDER FOR THE CONDUCT
OF TRAINING ON HAZARD IDENTIFICATION, RISK ASSESSMENT AND DETERMINING
CONTROL (HIRADC) AND ASPECT IMPACT IDENTIFICATION AND ASSESSMENT –
HEAD OFFICE AND PORT MANAGEMENT OFFICES
(ASD-020-2026)

I. INTRODUCTION

The mission to provide a responsive, reliable, and efficient port service while being at par with global best practices relies on management systems that ensures the performance of the programs and compliances of the Authority. As part of the Authority's promotion of its corporate environmental responsibility, PPA applies the ISO 14001:2015 Environmental Management System, a practical system that provides a holistic approach to managing business operations that have a significant impact on the environment. Compliance with the requirements of ISO 14001:2015 would improve the legal compliance with environmental laws and other regulations.

To perform the processes involved in the implementation of the ISO 14001:2015, PPA personnel needs to gain the skills and knowledge to perform Hazard Identification, Risk Analysis, and Determination of Controls (HIRADC) and Aspect Impact Identification and Assessment. This course is developed to capacitate PPA personnel with the concepts and processes involved in the performance of HIRADC and identification of environmental aspects and impact evaluation based on the implementation of ISO 14001:2015.

This 24-hour course is designed to equip participants with the essential knowledge and skills needed to perform HIRADC and Aspect Impact Identification and Assessment as part of the implementation of the ISO 14001:2015 Environmental Management System.

II. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

2.1 Project Duration

To cover a period of one (1) year.

2.2 Project Scope

The services to be rendered shall cover the training programs identified in Section I hereof.

III. OBJECTIVES AND TOPICS

Performance Objective

The participants shall be able to identify hazards, assess risks, and determine control measures (HIRADC) and identify environmental aspects and conduct impact evaluation in compliance with the requirements of the ISO 14001:2015.

Objectives

During the training, the participants will be able to:

- Recognize the concept and terms of Hazard Identification, Risk Assessment and Determining Controls (HIRADC) in relation to Environment Management System;
- Discuss the procedures involved in the HIRADC and the Aspects/Impact Identification and Assessment based on the Integrated Management System (IMS); and
- Perform the HIRADC and Aspect Impact Identification and Assessment through workshops.

Topics

- Introduction to HIRADC and ESH Concepts
- Identification of Environmental and Occupational Safety and Health (ESH) Hazards
- Assessment of Environmental Impacts
- Determination of Risk-Based Controls

IV. SCOPE OF SERVICES AND REQUIREMENTS

The Service Provider contracted shall follow the minimum requirements stated below for the conduct of the training on Hazard Identification, Risk Assessment and Determining Control (HIRADC) and Aspect and Impact Identification and Assessment:

4.1 Qualifications of Service Provider:

1. Must have subject matter experts (SMEs) in ISO Standards, hazard identification, risk assessment and determining control, and aspect and impact identification and assessment;
2. Must have extensive pool of SMEs to ensure availability of trainers in case of simultaneous conduct of training;
3. Must have an experience with government procurement bidding process;
4. Must have basic understanding of PPA's mandate and functions;
5. Must have implemented similar training for both public and private organizations;
6. Must have capability to implement both in-person and online training;
7. Must have at least five (5) years experience in-person training delivery and two (2) years for online training;
8. Must have obtained a Performance Evaluation rating of at least 80% for service provider with previous contract with PPA for the last three (3) years; and
9. Must have no existing service contract with or within PPA.

4.2 The Subject Matter Expert/s (SMEs) assigned to deliver the training shall have the following criteria:

1. Should be graduate of four-year degree course, with at least three (3) years of work experience as lecturer/facilitator in delivering training programs of similar nature to public and/or private sector organizations;
2. Preferably with postgraduate degree related with the subject matter (but not required);
3. Technical Certification/Training on ISO Standards related to IMS;
4. Relevant work experience in the implementation of IMS; and
5. Capable to deliver both in-person and online training.

V. SERVICE PROVIDER RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Provide one (1) subject matter expert to deliver each batch of training;
2. Conduct the training on site/in-person and online (when necessary);
3. Shoulder the SMEs air, land, and sea transportation fare and accommodation (when necessary);
4. Communicate the training engagement protocols to PPA thru the Training Institute (PPATI) prior to training implementation;
5. Submit course design two (2) weeks prior to the conduct of training in accordance with PPA requirements for approval;
6. Submit the electronic copies of the course modules, master copy of the participant's workbook, exercise forms and training handouts including copy of the International Organization for Standardization (ISO) standard (for training purposes) prior to the conduct of the training in accordance with PPA requirements;
7. Provide the following to the participants:
 - electronic copy of training handouts
 - electronic and hardcopy of certificate of training at most 10 working days after the conduct of the training, and
 - electronic and hardcopy of Pre and Post-tests;
8. Submit results of all related tests/evaluations/assessments to PPA thru PPATI;
9. Personal Data collected from PPA Personnel shall solely be used for training purposes only and be protected under the Republic Act No. 10173 also known as Data Privacy Act of 2012; and
10. Perform other services necessary for the delivery of the training.

VI. PPA RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Provide the number of enrollees as stated;
2. Provide the meals, training venue, relevant supplies and equipment, accommodation, per diem and transportation of participants;
3. Shoulder the meals, and accommodation of one (1) SME with the following conditions:
 - 3.1. Meals include lunch, and AM & PM snacks (meals outside training hours and other incidental expenses shall be shouldered by the SME).
 - SMEs may opt to stay at PPA Port Management Office's dormitory when available. In any case that the PMO's dormitory is not available, the service provider shall provide the necessary provision for the SME's accommodation
4. Coordinate the training program;
5. Issue a separate Certificate of Training to each participants;
6. Ensure that each participant has necessary materials and supplies needed for the training;
7. Provide the online platform in the event the training will be conducted online due to uncontrollable situation; and
8. Pay the service provider as per contract.

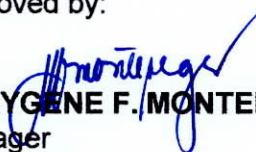
